- **Adoration of Jenna Fox** by Mary E. Pearson

Jenna Fox has just woken up after a serious accident. She's been in a coma for an entire year and doesn't remember who she is or what happened. Her parents try filling in the blanks, but as Jenna starts to remember, she's faced with more questions than answers. What really happened to her? And what are her parents hiding?

- **All these things I've done** by Gabrielle Zevin

In a dystopian future where chocolate and caffeine are contraband, teenage cellphone use is illegal, and water and paper are carefully rationed, sixteen-year-old Anya Balanchine finds herself thrust unwillingly into the spotlight as heir apparent to an important New York City crime family.

- **Blood Red Road** by Moira Young (*book 1 of Dustlands trilogy*)

In a distant future, eighteen-year-old Lugh is kidnapped, and while his twin sister Saba and nine-year-old Emmi are trailing him across bleak Sandsea they are captured, too, and taken to brutal Hopetown, where Saba is forced to be a cage fighter until new friends help plan an escape.

- **City of Bones** by Cassandra Clare

Suddenly able to see demons and the Darkhunters who are dedicated to returning them to their own dimension, fifteen-year-old Clary Fray is drawn into this bizarre world when her mother disappears and Clary herself is almost killed by a monster.

- **City of Ember** by Jeanne du Prau

Ember is an entire city...underground! In fact, the people of Ember don't know that "above ground" exists. Hundreds of years ago, leaders moved their people below ground to save them, and put the instructions for how to return in a special box for safe-keeping. First, that box goes missing and then the giant generator that powers their whole world starts breaking down...the citizens of Ember need to figure out how to save themselves from extinction!

- **Delirium** by Lauren Oliver

Lena looks forward to receiving the government-mandated cure that prevents the **delirium** of love and leads to a safe, predictable, and happy life, until ninety-five days before her eighteenth birthday and her treatment, when she falls in love.

- **Divergent** by Veronica Roth

In a future Chicago, sixteen-year-old Beatrice Prior must choose among five predetermined factions to define her identity for the rest of her life, a decision made more difficult when she discovers that she is an anomaly who does not fit into any one group, and that the society she lives in is not perfect after all.

- **Ender's Game** by Orson Scott Card

Earth is about to be invaded by a hostile alien race. The defense plan? Train an army of children! Ender Wiggen is the unlikely candidate recruited to join the troops. Even if you don't normally like science fiction, I DARE you not to love this book!

- **Graceling** by Kristen Cashore

In a world where some people are born with extreme and often-feared skills called Graces, Katsa struggles for redemption from her own horrifying Grace, the Grace of killing, and teams up with another young fighter to save their land from a corrupt king.

- **Glow** by Amy Kathleen Ryan

Part of the first generation to be conceived in deep space, fifteen-year-old Waverly is expected to marry young and have children to populate a new planet, but a violent betrayal by the dogmatic leader of their sister ship could have devastating consequences.

- **Gone** by Michael Grant (*book 1 of series*)

In a small town on the coast of California, everyone over the age of fourteen suddenly disappears, setting up a battle between the remaining town residents and the students from a local private school, as well as those who have "The Power" and are able to perform supernatural feats and those who do not.

- **House of the Scorpion** by Nancy Farmer

In a future where humans despise clones, Matt enjoys special status as the young clone of El Patron, the 142-year-old leader of a corrupt drug empire nestled between Mexico and the United States.

- **Jennifer Government** by Max Barry

In a corporate-governed future world where people take the last names of the companies they work for, Hack Nike tries to get out of a contract that requires him to shoot teenagers and finds himself pursued by a government agent.

- **Matched** by Ally Condie (*book 1 of series*)

Cassia has always trusted the Society to make the right choices for her, so when Xander appears on-screen at her Matching ceremony, Cassia knows he is her ideal mate--until Ky Markham's face appears for an instant before the screen fades to black

- **Maze Runner** by James Dashner (*book 1 of trilogy*)

Sixteen-year-old Thomas wakes up with no memory in the middle of a **maze** and realizes he must work with the community in which he finds himself if he is to escape.

- **Uglies** by Scott Westerfeld (*book 1 of series*)

Just before their sixteenth birthdays, when they will be transformed into beauties whose only job is to have a great time, Tally's best friend runs away and Tally must find her and turn her in, or never become pretty at all.
